Summary for the testing of the solutions with Atos

Introduction

The following is the external summary from the testing of the Customs solution with Atos

The dialogue with the market were conducted in order for Implementation Center for Danish Customs (ICT), under the Danish Ministry of Tax, to obtain further knowledge regarding available solutions on the market. Focus for the dialogue were to test solutions based on standard functionality which can fulfill part of the Danish customs agency's needs.

The dialogue with the market is not intended to pre-select or pre-exclude market operators in future tenders and thus will not qualify or exclude any market operators from future tenders. Focus for the dialogue has been to discuss products on the market and the functionality of these.

Date for meeting	17-11-2017
Welcome and presentation of the market operator's participants	The Market operator welcomed Implementation Center for Customs (ICT) and presented the participants from their side, including their former relevant experience.
Formal framework for trying of the solutions	Implementation Center for Customs presented the agenda for the day and the guidelines for how ICT wished to conduct the meeting. Furthermore, the Legal formal framework for the test day was presented. ICT informed the Market operator that an external summary would be available at the Ministry's webpage after the range of meetings were conducted to secure fair and equal treatment of potential market operators.
Session 0: The market operators experience and suggestions on slicing and sizing their solution	<p>The market operator presented their company and explained their experience from previous and ongoing projects. Additionally, they presented their experience within customs and other fields, highlighting a few of them to showcase experience or credentials they deemed relevant for ICT.</p> <p>Furthermore, the market operator shortly commented on working agile and presented their take on how to best scope a procurement their solution based on their experience from previous projects. This also included their take, on a potential release plan.</p>
Session 1: Testing of the process – practical test of predetermined process	The market operator gave an overview and a brief explanation of how they viewed declaration management on the basis of their solution. They then demonstrated a working end-to-end declaration management process including the functions that the process utilized. This demonstration was based on the scenario provided by ICT prior to the meeting.





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	<p>The demonstration focused on explaining how the process functioned and data flowed.</p> <p>The market operator also touched upon how they would ensure that their system would be compliant and which possibilities for configuration that is available into the solution.</p>
Session 2: Assessment of the solution/architecture	<p>The market operator explained the technological base of their solution and showed their conceptual architecture model. This also entailed an explanation of their hardware setup capabilities. Additionally, the Market operator explained the software stack used and gave recommendations on choice of software to use within their solution.</p> <p>Furthermore, they presented the standards they follow and the tools used for development, just as data ownership structure was explained before the session was completed with a presentation of their dashboard possibilities.</p>
Session 3: Assessment of the delivery	<p>The market operator explained lessons learned from previous projects touching upon working agile but focusing on how to replace old systems and transitioning into new.</p> <p>Additionally, the Market operator presented their expectations to ICT as an organization.</p>
Further process	<p>Lastly the further process was explained by ICT. ICT referred to the overall timeline published on the Ministry of Taxations webpage and explained that there is expected to be a meeting in the beginning of 2018 where more information about the expected tender material and tender process will be explained.</p>
